Outfitted in a hard hat, miner's head lamp and a yellow slicker, thousands of Bisbee visitors descend into the Queen Mine Tour each year — heading underground and back in time. Tour guides, retired Phelps Dodge employees, lead the group 1,500 feet into the mine and recount mining days, techniques, dangers and drama.

The Equestrians have a Home in APACHE JUNCTION!

With views of the legendary Superstition Mountains to the East, and Four Peaks and the Goldfield Mountains to the north, the Apache Junction Rodeo Event Center is located in a prime location for equestrians, outdoor enthusiasts, and nature lovers. Home to signature events such as the annual Lost Dutchman Days, Early Day Engine Tractor Show, Ben Johnson Days and more, the center is a gem in the desert.

After leasing the land since 1986, the City recently purchased and now owns the property. "We are so thrilled to take the next step in our city that has embraced the equestrian community and has long roots with the Lost Dutchman Days rodeo," said Apache Junction Mayor Chip Wilson. "Our purchase of the rodeo grounds opens the door to more events and more visitors to our city." The 20 acre site currently

features a fully equipped rodeo arena, covered bleachers, restroom/concession facilities and associated parking. The City will be doing a Master Plan update to help prioritize future amenities at the event center that will support and enhance existing and future events.

Currently, the Rodeo Event Center can be rented for events, as well as individual or group use of the lighted arena. A complete list of fees and facility use guidelines can be found at www.apachejunctionaz.gov/facilityrentals. Archery lessons/tournaments, ATV Safety courses, 4H activities, and a variety of equestrian events and activities are currently happening at the center. We expect to see many more concert and rodeo-style events in the near future.

With over 2.9 million serene desert acres, the Tonto National Forest borders east Mesa and Apache Junction. We continuously feature and promote attractions and recreation opportunities along its border so in this issue we are including **equine associations** in the northeastern portion of the East Valley. Those interested in horse riding can access local stables with riding options in the "Things to Do" section.

The **Superstition Horsemen's Association (SHA)** was created by a handful of Apache Junction-community equine owners in 1980 to support and maintain the "rural and western lifestyle," to go along with the city's "Western" themed downtown district.

Today our non-profit continues to focus on the rights and privileges of horsemen, promote the humane treatment of horses and actively pursue favorable legislation concerning these objectives.

SHA is celebrating 43 years of working with trail partners such as the **East Valley Back Country Horsemen**, a local chapter of the Back Country Horsemen of America, which just celebrated its 50th anniversary. The local chapter volunteer members assist with trail maintenance and improvement projects, working closely with local land management agencies to clear and maintain public trails to "keep the trails open for all" and "keep trails open for future generations." This includes pack horse support by carrying in supplies, including tools, food, water and specialized equipment to remote areas. They focus on trails for non-motorized use, which includes horsemen, hikers and mountain bikers.

VISIT ORGAN **PIPE CACTUS NATIONAL MONUMENT**

This sprawling intact ecosystem shelters a surprisingly diverse community of animals and plants in its 516 square miles, and includes miles of scenic roads and hiking trails for those yearning to explore the heart of the Sonoran Desert.

Located roughly midway between Tucson and Yuma, Organ Pipe Cactus National Monument encompasses an incredible diversity of Sonoran Desert plants and animals. All told, 28 species of cactus can be found throughout the park, including the namesake organ pipe, which is found almost nowhere else in the United States. This is wild country, fierce and full of secrets.

Within the national monument, Twin Peaks



The Deserts in Mohave

The deserts in Mohave, La Paz, and Yuma Counties (Arizona's "West Coast") are the canvas for a myriad of recreational activities. The popularity of Off-Highway travel and hiking, have exploded in recent years. The creation of the Arizona Peace Trail, Inc., Quartzsite Off-Road, and local clubs have provided direction and focus for off-road fun and safety.

Arizona Peace Trail

The Arizona Peace Trail is a 675-mile ultimate off-road adventure. It is a loop route through Mohave, La Paz, and Yuma Counties; currently the longest off-road trail in Arizona. There are 34 trail segments which are detailed in the "Arizona Peace Trail Atlas." A digital Global Positioning route map is available for free download at: **www.arizonapeacetrail.org.**

The Arizona Peace Trail was first conceived by the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) and the Arizona Game and Fish Department (AZGFD). In July 2013, the two agencies discussed the creation a connector trail between Bullhead City, AZ in the North and Yuma, AZ in the South. The vision was to create designated desert trails for public use; and, stimulate tourism.

In 2013, The House Ghost Riders club under the direction of president, JC Sanders, brought land managers from federal, state, county, and city agencies, private landowners and OHV, enthusiasts together to develop the trail. By January 2014, 14 different OHV clubs with the cooperation of BLM, AZGFD, Yuma County, La Paz County, and Mohave County formed the Arizona Peace Trail, Inc., which gained non-profit status in July 2015.

There are over one thousand miles of off-road trails in the Quartzsite area. Quartzsite Off-Road is a non-profit under the aegis of The Quartzsite Improvement Association, founded to promote safety, off-road information, and tourism.

In 2016, the "Quartzsite Off-Road Atlas" was created to provide a guide to the 1000's of miles of area trails with topographic maps, routes, points-of-interest, laws, safety recommendations, and other information. Quartzsite Off-Road has no paid employees, and all proceeds from the sale of the Atlas are used for off-road safety and promotion; and, support for local non-profit organizations.

Quartzsite Off-Road has a website, *quartzsiteoffroad.com*, and Facebook sites, "Quartzsite Off-Road," and "Quartzsite Off-Road Buy Sell and Trade." The Atlas is available online, and in local stores. Off-road "Meet and Greet" informational meetings are held on the first Wednesday at QIA, November thru March, in conjunction with The Arizona Sunriders OHV Club which has also been instrumental in promoting OHV trails, safety, and fun.







CASA MALPAIS Archaeological Park

Located in the White Mountains, near the Town of Springerville in northwestern Arizona, at 7000 ft elevation is a late Mogollon site, dating back to about 1250 and 1340 AD, situated on a basalt lava flow. The site contains exciting discoveries including a Great Kiva, solar calendar, 50-60 room pueblo remains, and an ancient staircase that led up on the rim of a shield volcano that created Lava flow the site is located on. It has numerous means of tracking the sun, and is truly a remarkable site for its time. It became a National Historic Landmark in 1964. It can only bed visited by guided tours which originate in the Heritage Museum, located at 418 -East Main St, Springerville, AZ 85938. 928.333.5375 Please note the tour is two hours, 3/4 mile hike on steep, rocky surfaces.

It's time to Mogollon in the White Mountains

See some of the most far reaching scenery in Arizona. Stand atop a 2,000 foot drop along the top of the Mogollon Rim, (there are several pronunciations, take your choice, moo-guh-yohn or moggy-yawn), stretching 200 miles from Yavapai County to New Mexico. It is a true geological wonder hosting sedimentary, volcanic and metamorphic rock dating back to the Precambrian era.

Enjoy a leisure picnic or trek along the historic hiking and horseback riding trails.

Drive Forest Road 300 (Rim Road), a 43 mile scenic drive along the top of the rim with awe-inspiring panoramic vistas along the entire route. While unpaved, it is well maintained for ease of travel. It accesses several pristine lakes, of which have some of the clearest water in Arizona. Fishing in them is more than spectacular!



The easiest access is from Payson, (State Road 87), east on State Road 260, approximately 30 miles to the top of the rim. At the top, turn left to enjoy the spectacular views. The scenic Rim Road starts here, continuing west to State Road 87, north of Payson.



From early days in Arizona's territorial history, Yuma was considered to be the gateway to California. A settlement was built along with a bridge over the Colorado River and history was made.

Today, Yuma is a bustling community that carefully preserves its history and offers a comfortable winter climate for RVers to enjoy. The river makes water sports and fishing convenient, and varied wildlife refuges, parks and trails offer great ways to get

outdoor exercise. For indoor fun there are nearby casinos, shopping and some historical attractions that demonstrate the role Yuma played in bringing commerce through Arizona.

Wellton, to the east of Yuma, is a smaller city with its own charms. There are plenty of small-town activities to keep you busy while you enjoy the mild temperatures and easy lifestyle.








From the intersection of I-40 & I-17, head west on I-40 approximately 15 minutes to Exit 185 (Hughes Ave/Bellemont). Turn right onto Brannigan Park Rd, continue straight through a roundabout. Continue to Forest Service Rd 171. Turn right to the Resort entrance.
